




Tribe Background

- Population: 5000 people living on the Reservation
- Main Industries: Indian Head Casino, Kah-nee-ta Resort, WS Forest Products
 - Developing- Drone Park, Cannabis Production

Warm Springs and Tribal Public Health Accreditation

- Direct Service Tribe through IHS
- Went through 638 process in 2008- Tribe now oversees Community
 Health Services: Immunizations, communicable disease investigations,
 Maternal Child Health, Nutrition, Community Health Representatives,
 Diabetes Prevention, Medical Social Workers



Warm Springs and Tribal Public Health Accreditation Continued

- Started looking into Tribal Public Health Accreditation- Spring 2016
- Attended Tribal Health Forum in Spokane- August 2016
- Started working on CHA through BRFSS and other tribal departments-Summer 2016
- Received grant from NIHB for Tribal ASI to help develop and administer BRFSS for CHA- Fall 2016

Behavior Risk Factor Surveillance Survey


Working with NPAIHB to develop the tool

Community Health Assessment

- BRFSS
- Annual Health Report from our Joint Health Commission Report that is presented annually to Tribal Council
 - Includes information from all departments funded through the Health and Human Services Branch along with IHS



Challenges Experienced

- Staff Turnover- Community Health Services has had 5 Managers in 9 years
- Using BRFSS for CHA
- New Staff- all leads on this project have been in their positions for less than 12 months
- Prioritizing accreditation along with other duties
