

Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians

- NC's only federally recognized Tribe
- Approximately 16,400 enrolled members
- Approximately 56,000 acres
- Approximately 10,000 years of local and regional history
- Economy: primarily gaming and tourism
- Government: Executive, Legislative, Judicial branches
- Independent hospital authority and school system

Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians Public Health and Human Services Division


- ► Health Delivery → Health and Medical → Public Health and Human Services
- **■** 289 staff
- ► Full-spectrum human services since 2014
- Includes long-term care facility, senior services, early childhood education, veteran services
- Transition of PH from IHS clinically-based model

PHHS and accreditation

- Began consideration in 2012
- Interrupted by implementation of Human Services Department, other staff and Tribal-level changes
- In place:
 - Part-time, contract Accreditation Coordinator (PHAB Site Visitor)
 - CDC Public Health Associate
 - Major partners: Cherokee Indian Hospital Authority (CIHA), USET Tribal Epidemiology Center (TEC), Western NC Health Network (WNCHN)


PHHS and accreditation: current status

- Strategic Plan updated December 2017; in implementation phase with priority teams
- THA/THIP
 - First THA 2013; THA in process
 - First THIP 2015-17; will resume after THA released
- QI Plan: in draft; QI Coordinator in place
- AHEOP in place
- ► PM system: under construction
- Documentation collection
- When?... Within the next year



Highlight: THA 2018

- Major differences from 2013:
 - Difficult to glean EBCI-specific health data → plethora of data (especially primary/ secondary quantitative)
 - More efficient community health survey process
 - Increased data on youth & elders (YRRS and DHHS elders surveys)
 - Intended community products



Highlight THA 2018: Focus Group/ Listening Session Facilitator Training



Highlight THA 2018: Focus Group/ Listening Session Facilitator Training

- Included PHHS, CIHA, and Cherokee Central Schools
- 22 participants
- Listening session topics chosen by THA Leadership Team
- 10 sessions scheduled; 5 completed
- Follow-up training: qualitative data analysis
- **►** Future:
 - Establish facilitator "community of practice"
 - Train-the-trainer
