## Seven Directions emerges as the first indigenous public health institute.



Support from a grant from the WK Kellogg Foundation united a dedicated group of American Indian leaders in public health. Together, they explored feasibility for an Indigenous focused public health institute (PHI). Through their hard work and commitment, they founded Seven Directions, A Center for Indigenous Public Health (<a href="https://www.sdciph.org">www.sdciph.org</a>). In April 2017, Seven Directions became the first member of the National Network of Public Health Institutes to focus on Indigenous health in the U.S.

Now, Seven Directions has been awarded a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to build a professional community focused on strengthening public health practice in American Indian and Alaska communities.





A community health assessment (sometimes called a CHA), also known as community health needs assessment (sometimes called a CHNA), refers to a state, tribal, local, or territorial health assessment that identifies key health needs and issues through systematic, comprehensive data collection and analysis. (CDC, n.d.). In efforts to learn more about the health of the MBCI community and how we can improve it, the Public Health Service will be developing a tribal specific community health assessment.
