

BHA-I

- Screening
- Initial intake process
- Case management
- Community education, prevention, early intervention

BHA-II

 Substance abuse assessment & treatment

BHA-III

- Rehabilitative services for clients with co-occurring disorders
- Quality assurance case reviews

BHP

- Team leadership
- Mentor/support BHA-I, II, and III

- Drug and Alcohol Assessment
- Case Management
- Aftercare group and individual counselling
- Support groups
- Culturally relevant services
 - Trauma and intergenerational trauma informed care
- Connecting people to their cultures and protective factors
